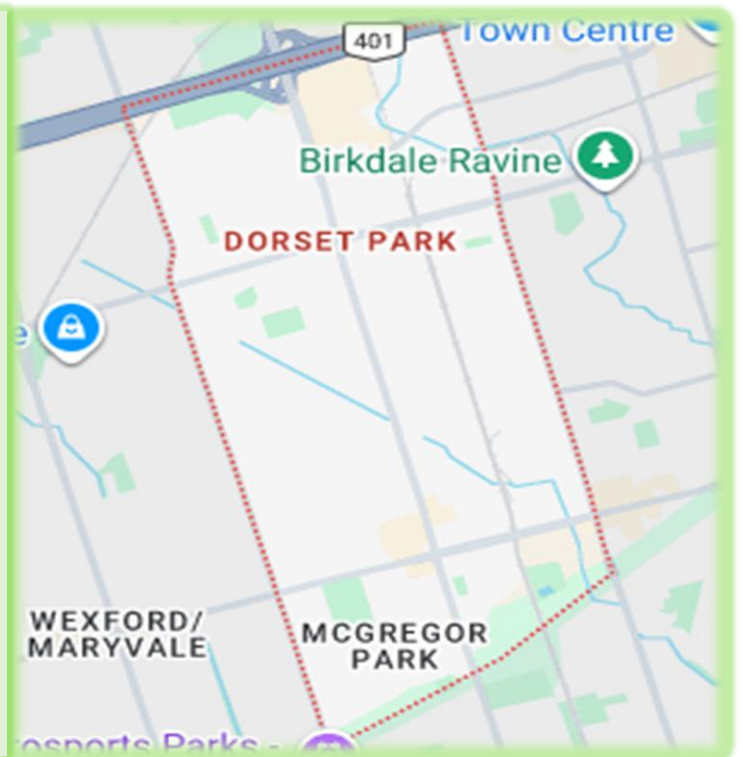


# DMC'S DORSET PARK NEWSLETTER

Kennedy Road runs along the neighbourhood's centre north and south and Ellesmere Road runs along the centre east and west. The area south of Lawrence Avenue, north of the hydro corridor, is known as McGregor Park and is often included as part of Dorset Park.

## THIS MONTH'S FEATURE

### Johnny's Shawarma: A Toronto Institution Built on Flavor and Family

In a city crowded with quick-service options, Johnny's Shawarma stands out by doing something deceptively simple: turning fast food into an expression of heritage. Based in Scarborough, the restaurant roots its identity in the Levant, with founders Johnny and Ani drawing on the flavors of Beirut and translating them into a menu that feels both comforting and distinct. Their story, as presented on the restaurant's website, is one of persistence, family labor, and a long commitment to serving Toronto diners since 1995.

What gives Johnny's its staying power is not just nostalgia, but range. The menu covers the expected classics—chicken, beef, and mixed shawarma wraps—but also expands into chicken and kafta kebobs, falafel, eggplant wraps, dinner platters with rice, hummus, tabbouleh, and potatoes, and even a shawarma poutine that nods to local cravings without abandoning the restaurant's Middle Eastern core. The house garlic paste and tahini sauce appear again and again, signaling that condiments here are not afterthoughts but part of the brand's signature. Vegetarian and vegan customers are not treated as side notes either, with falafel, fattoush, tabbouleh, grape leaves, and mixed vegetable options integrated naturally into the lineup.

There is also a clear understanding of how neighborhood restaurants survive: by becoming part of people's routines. Johnny's offers catering trays, wrap platters, salads, fries, and meat trays sized for groups, suggesting a business that has grown beyond counter service into celebrations, offices, and family gatherings. That flexibility matters. But so does the tone of the place. The site promises "Shawarma Addiction Guaranteed," a cheeky slogan that works because it is backed by nearly three decades of consistency. In an era when many food brands chase trends, Johnny's Shawarma makes a quieter argument: that longevity, generosity, and well-executed flavor are still the most persuasive forms of marketing.

## Shaping Futures: The Evolving

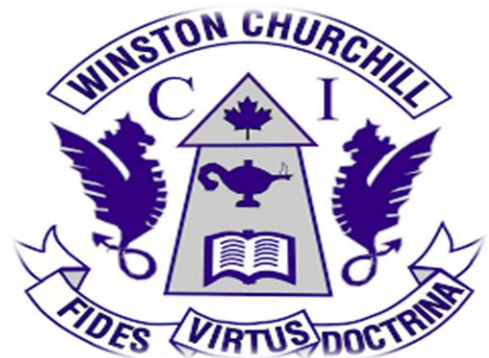
### Educational Landscape of Dorset Park

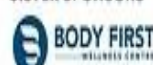

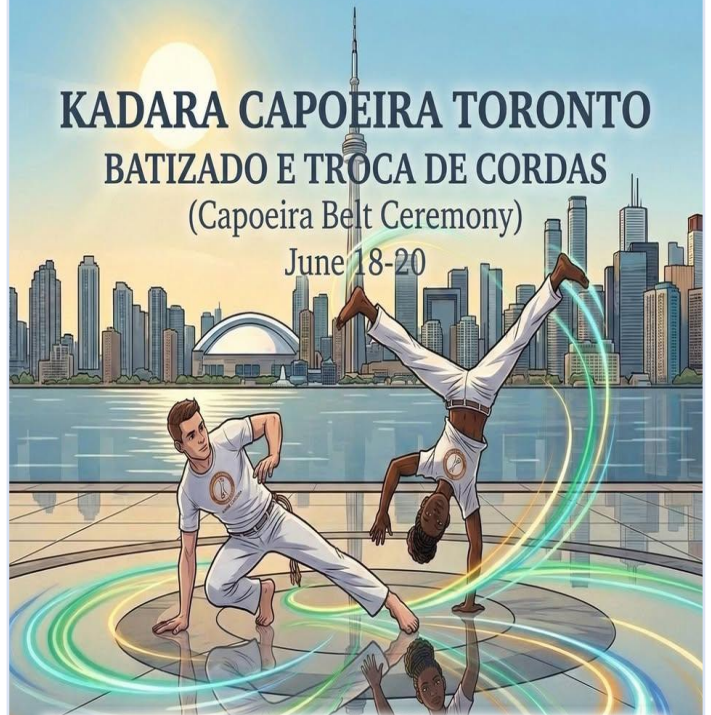

## How to Handle Common Rental Disagreements

Tenant Issue	Immediate Action Required	Key Rule to Remember
<b>Pests &amp; Disrepair</b>	Document everything with photos. Submit a formal request to your landlord in writing.	<b>Never withhold rent</b> , as this is grounds for legal eviction. Instead, file a T6 maintenance form with the LTB.
<b>Landlord Inaction</b>	Call 311 to file a complaint with the city's <a href="#">RentSafeTO Program</a> .	The city has escalating powers to execute safety repairs itself and bill negligent landlords directly.
<b>Illegal Rent Hikes</b>	Check if your building is rent-controlled (occupied before Nov 15, 2018).	Landlords cannot exceed the provincial guideline maximum without an approved Above Guideline Increase (AGI).
<b>Harassment or Threats</b>	Report the landlord to Ontario's <a href="#">Rental Housing Enforcement Unit (RHEU)</a> at 1-888-772-9277.	Forcing a tenant into a repayment plan or using harassment to force a move-out is illegal.
